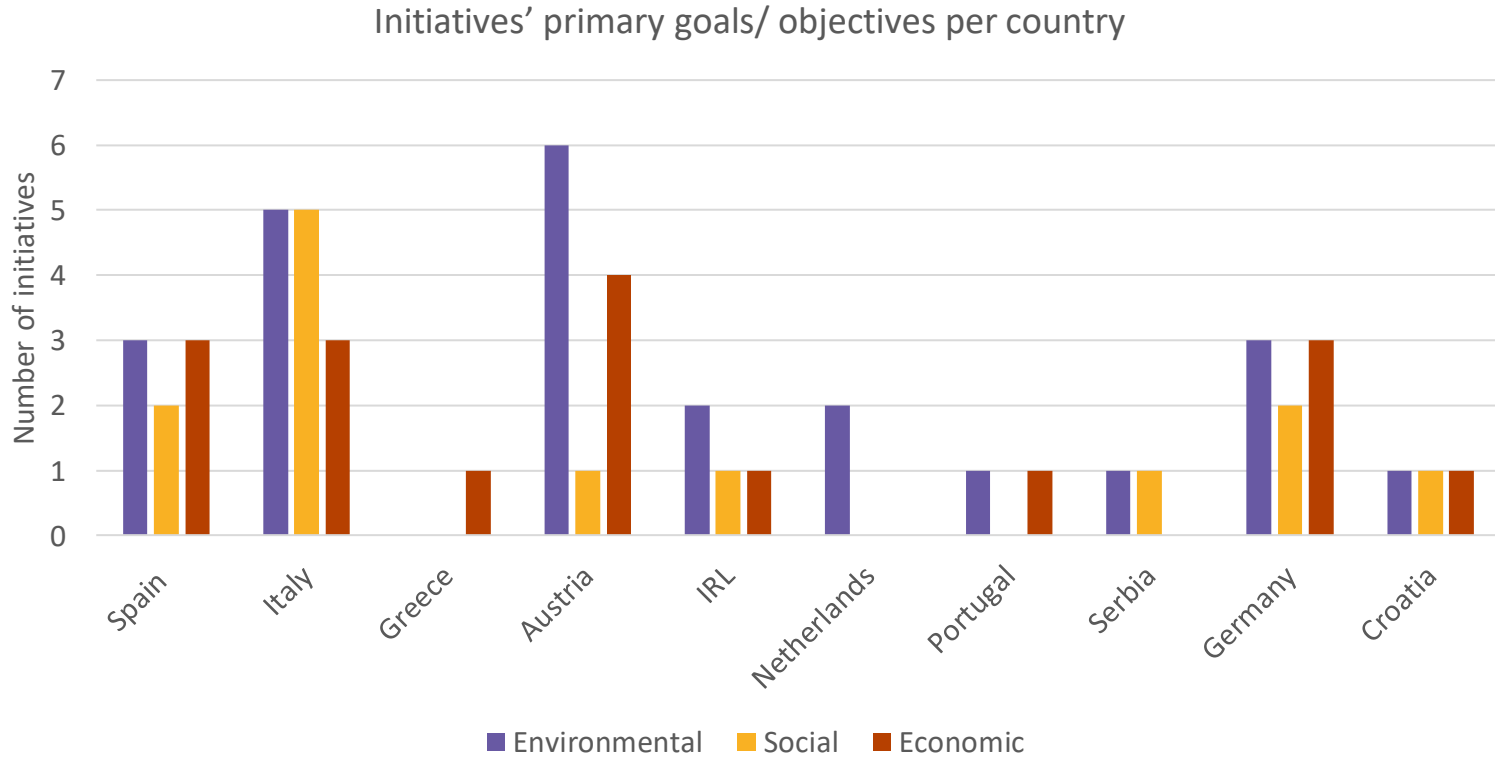

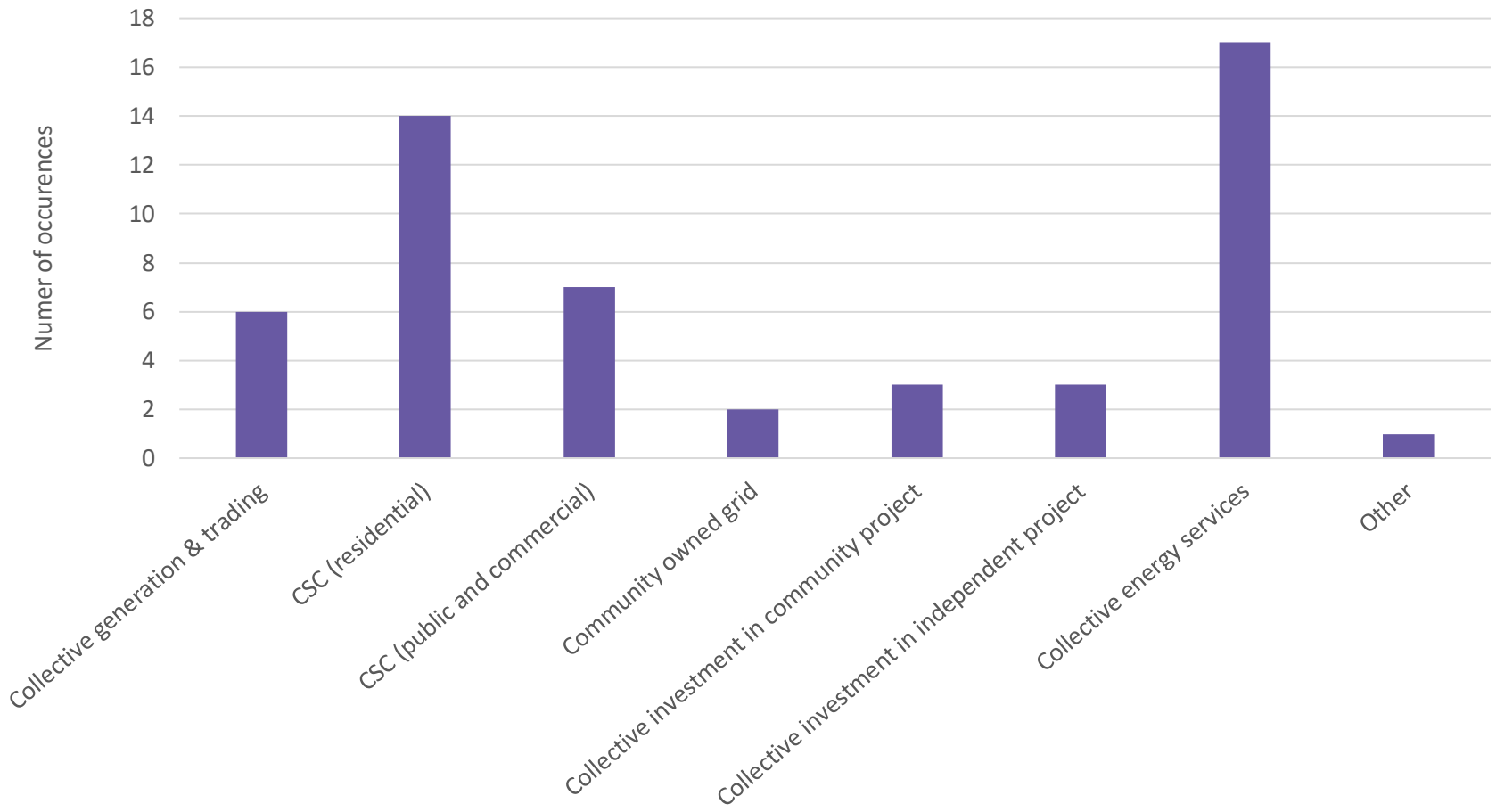
What is the key value proposition of your initiative ? (per country)



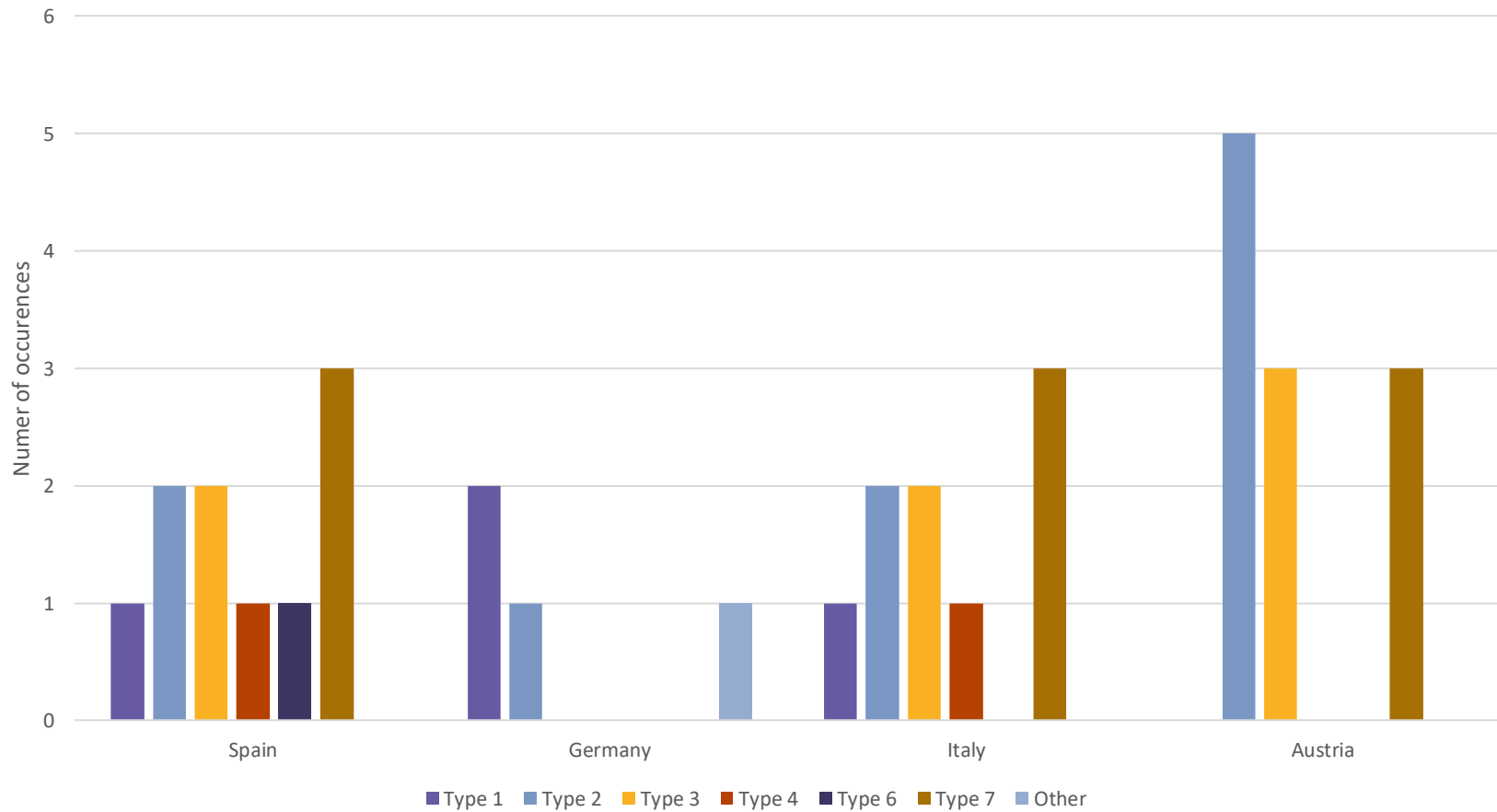

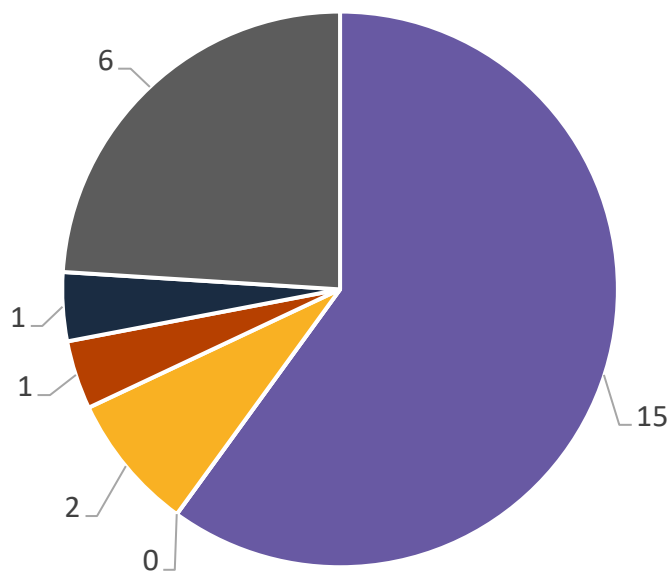

What are the most used business models types ? (per country)



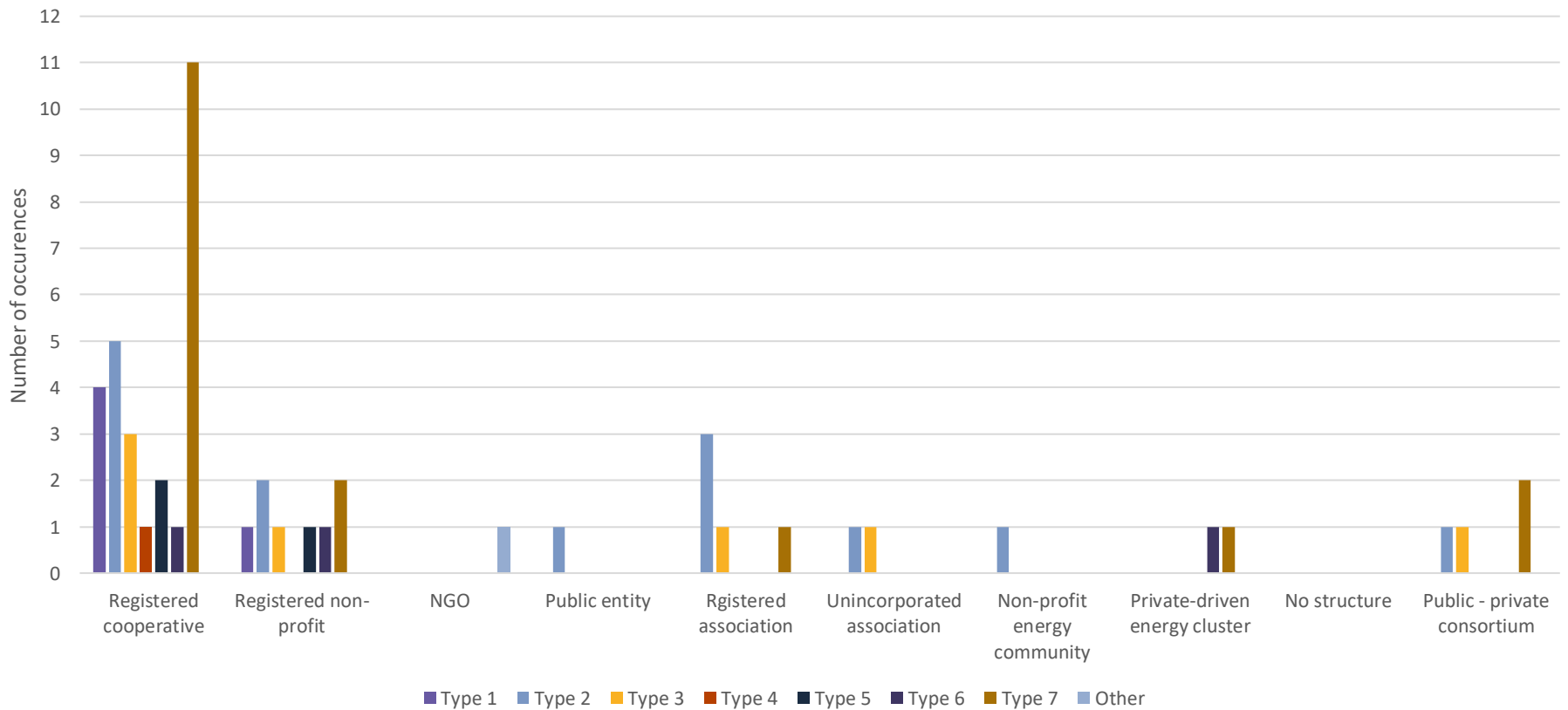

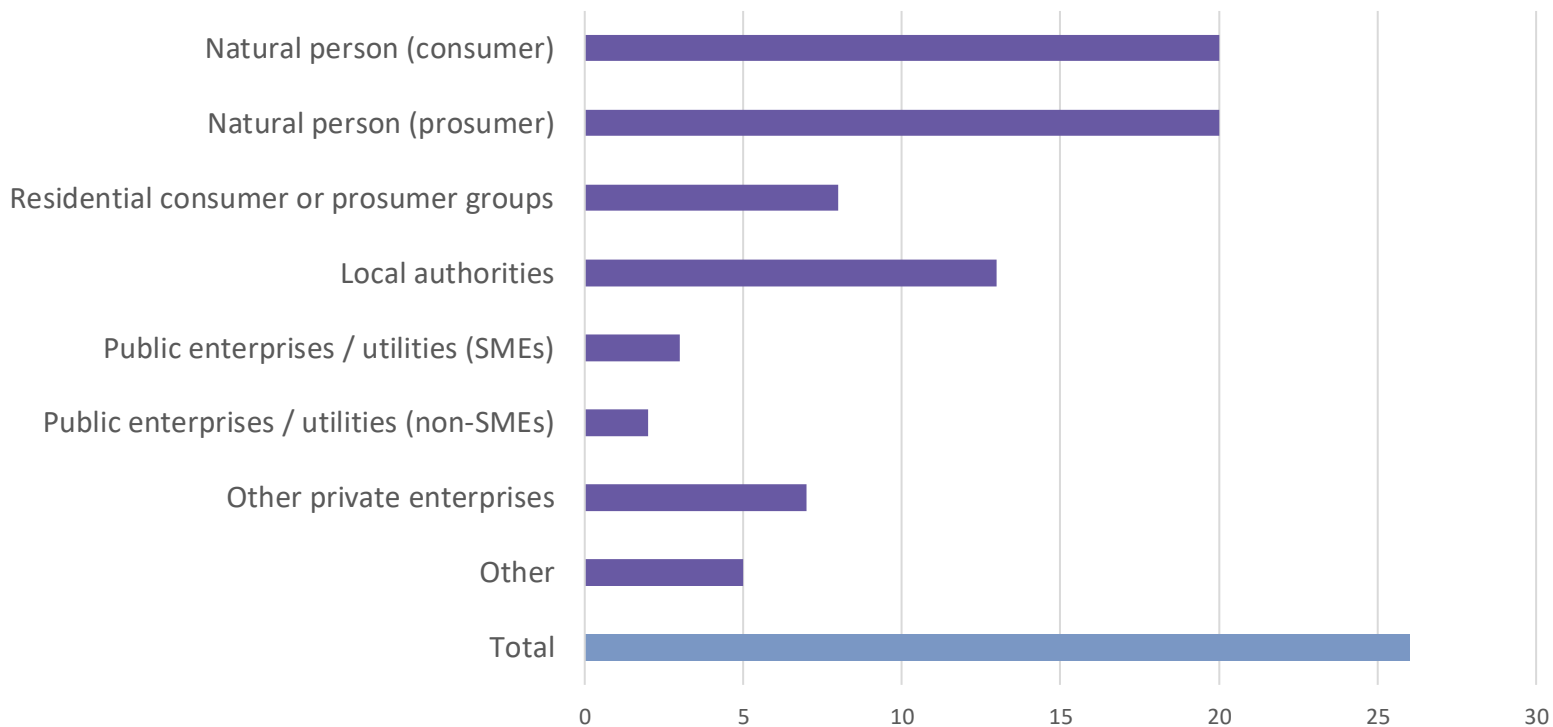

Other: registered association, non-for profit energy community, 1 public-private consortium, 1 initiative declared not to have any structure

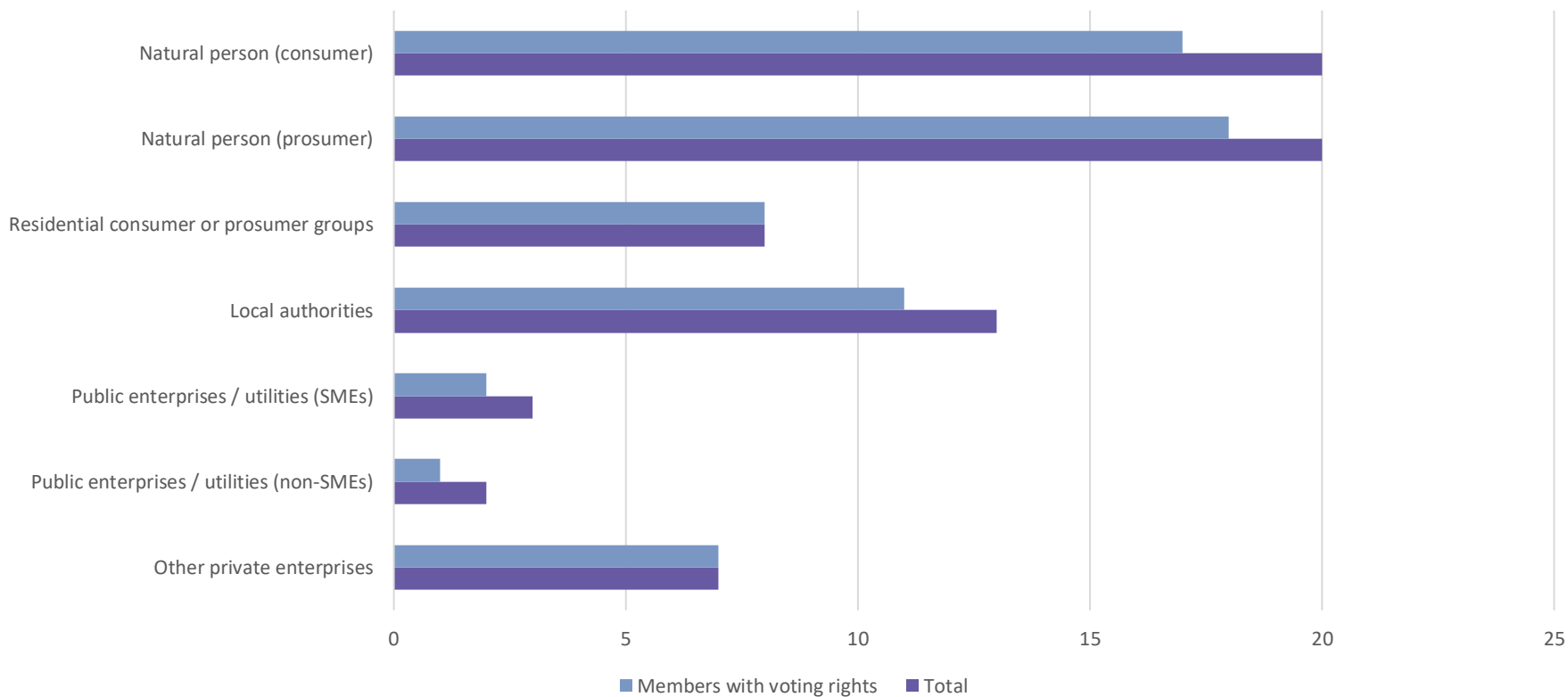
What business model types are the most used by different types of legal entities ?



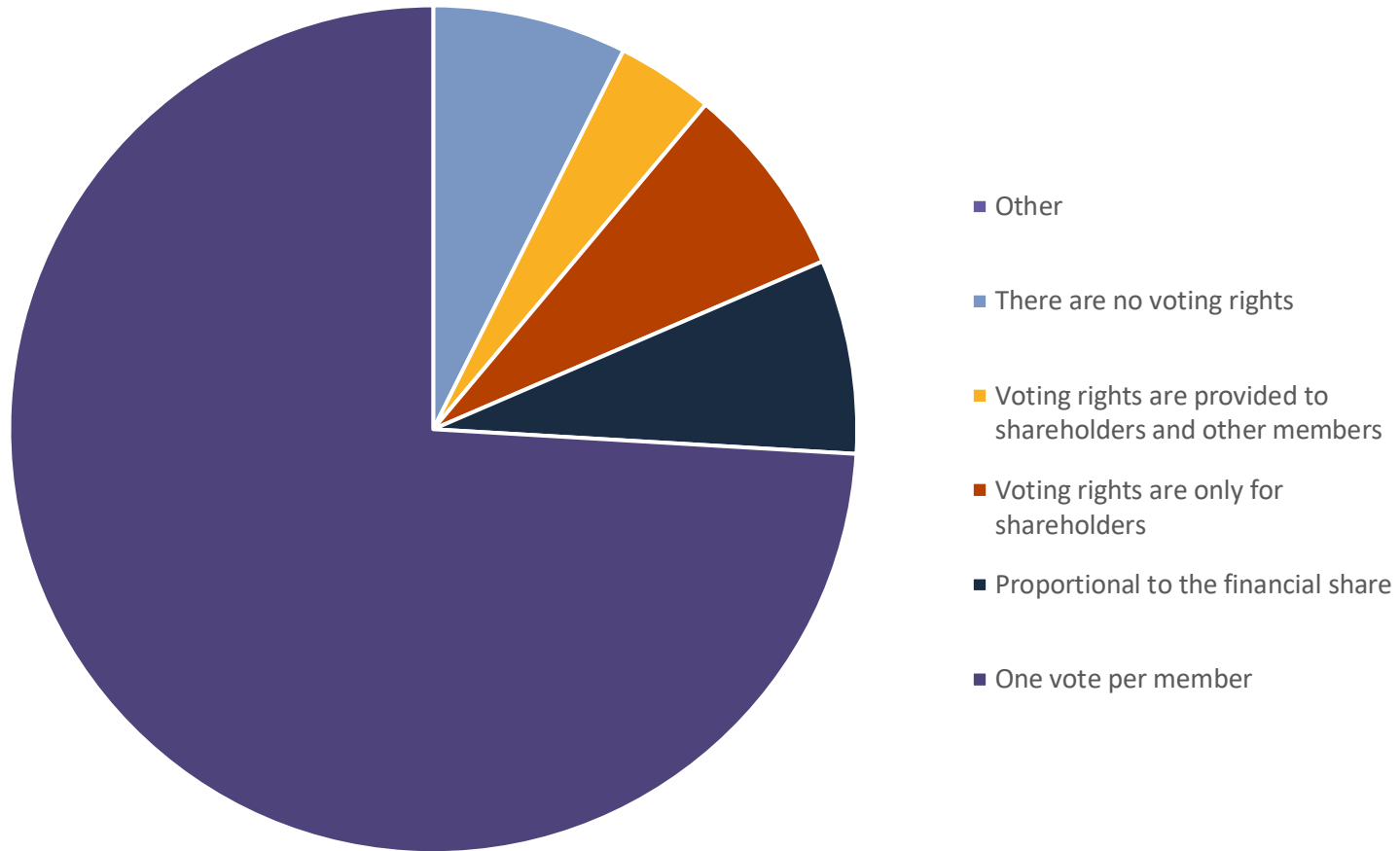
Which subjects are members of the initiative ?



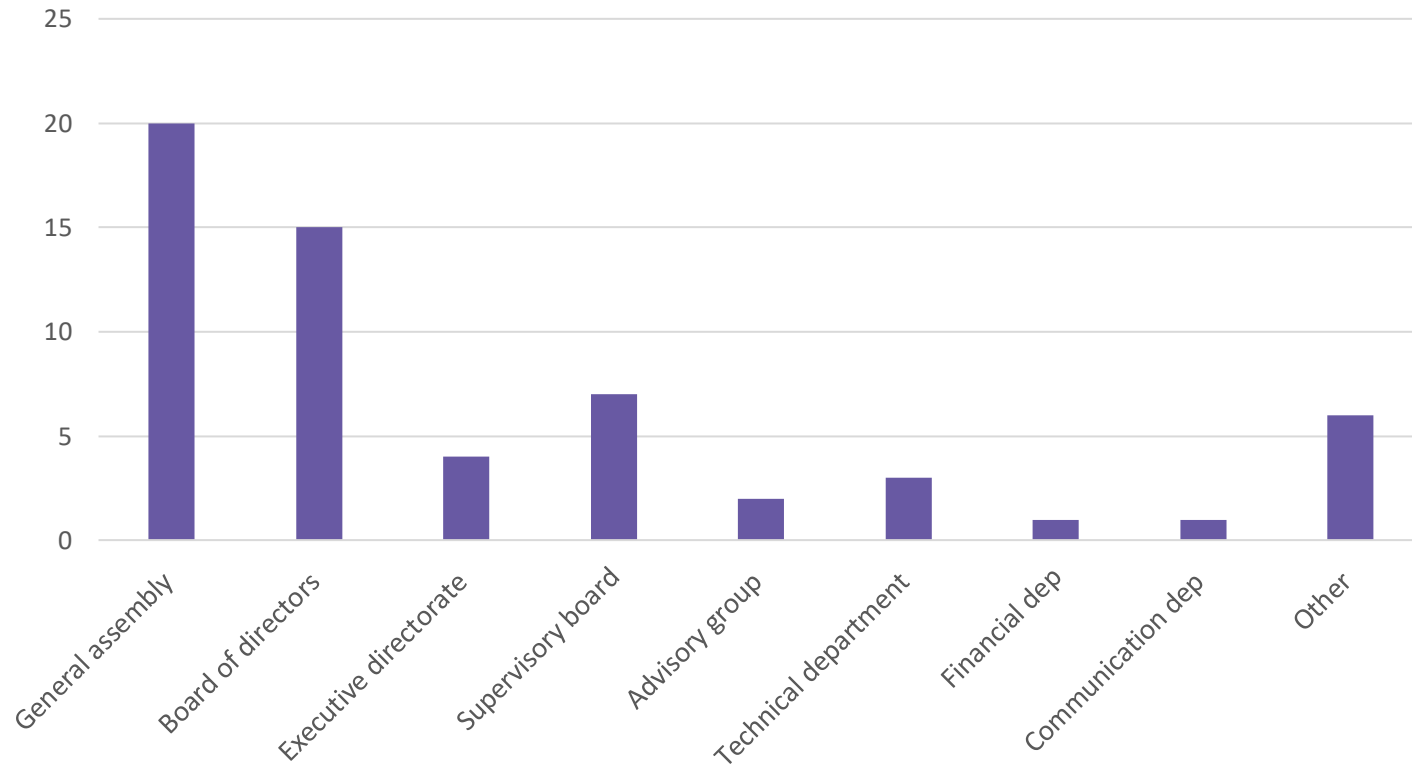
Which members of the initiative have voting rights ?



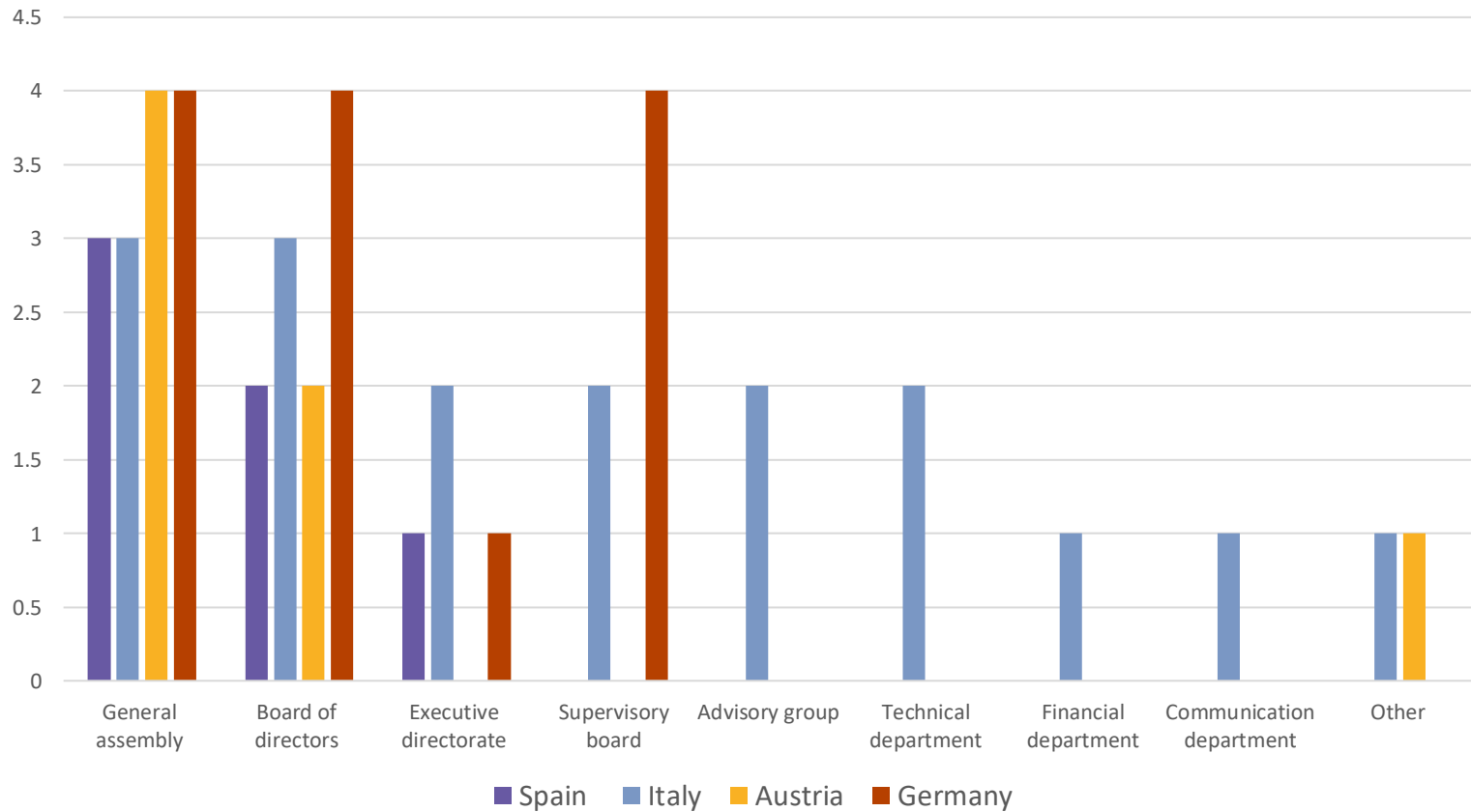
How are voting rights allocated ?

Key takeaways

- Social aspect is not key motivation of the initiatives
- Most initiatives uses the “registered cooperative” model
- Within registered cooperatives, CSC residential, generation & trading and energy services: mobility are the most used business model types
- Natural persons (consumers and prosumers) outnumber other types of members of the initiatives
- Important number of initiatives include local authorities and private companies, not many of them include public companies (utilities)
- Most of the initiatives declared rather democratic decision-making process („one member, one vote rule“)

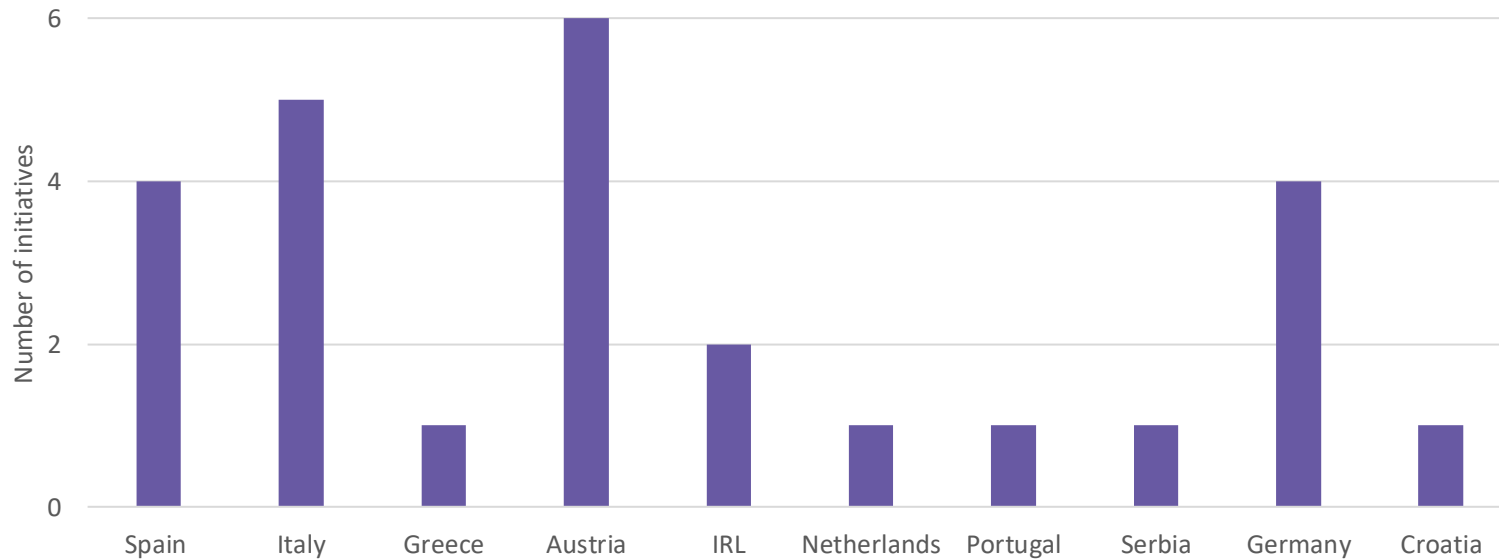

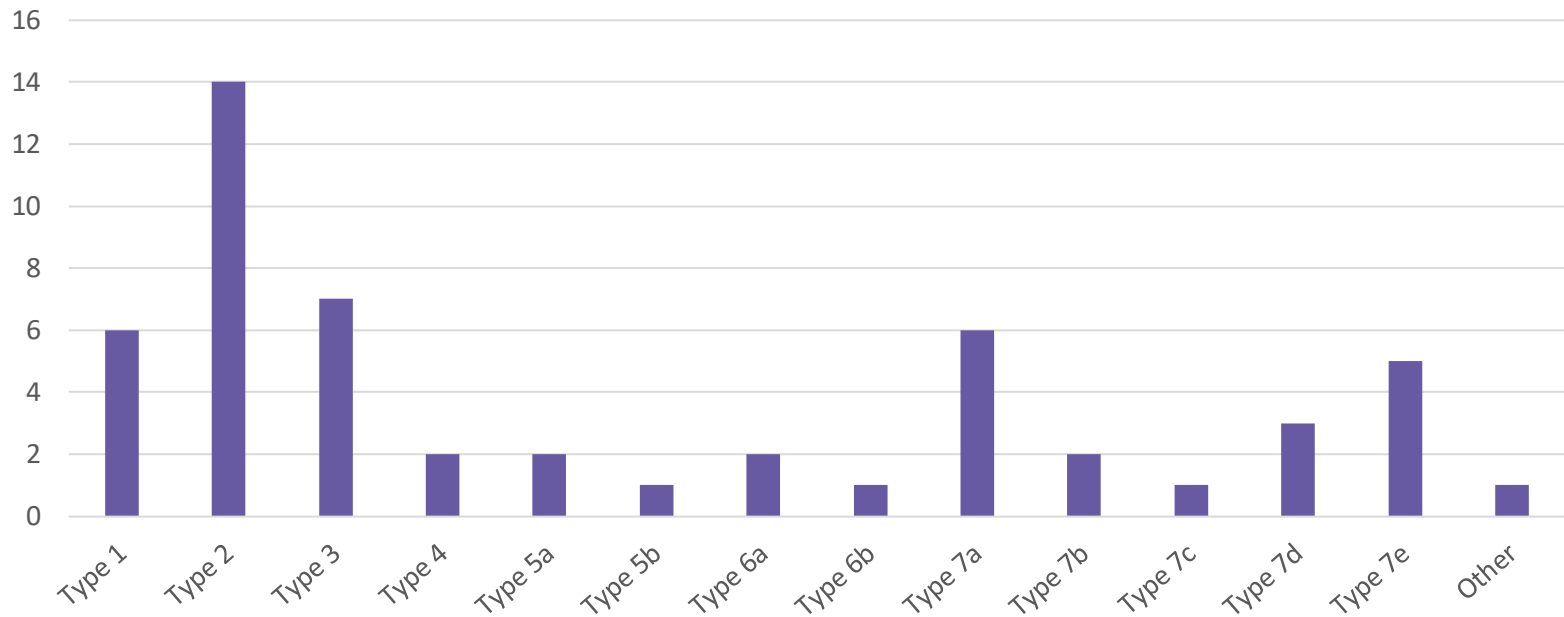

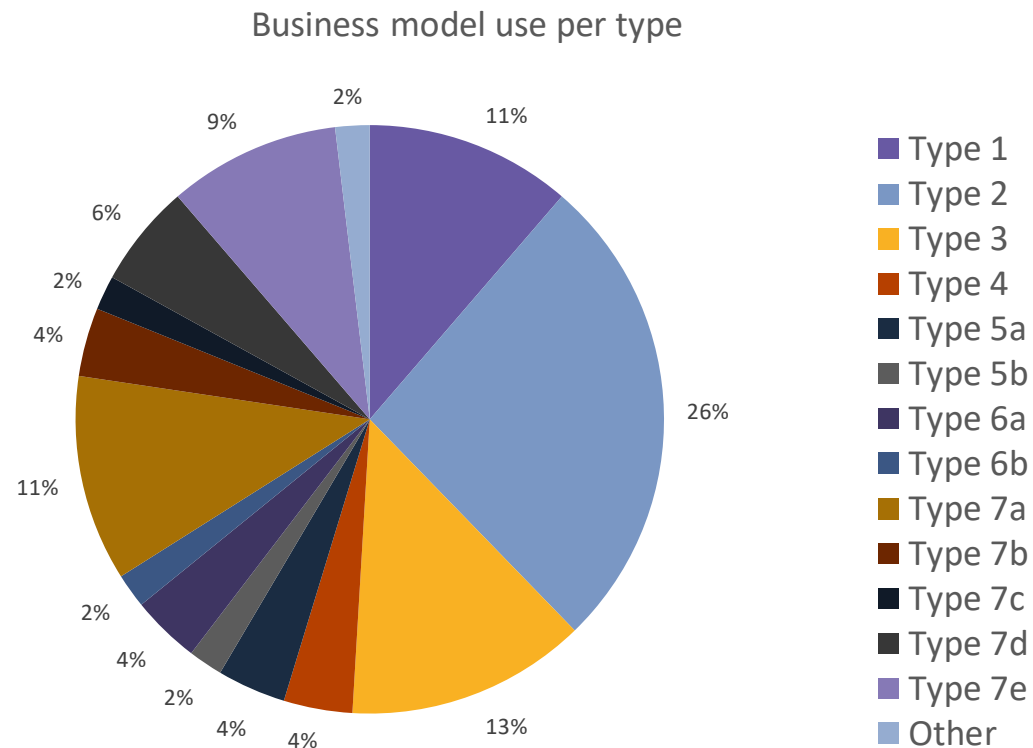
